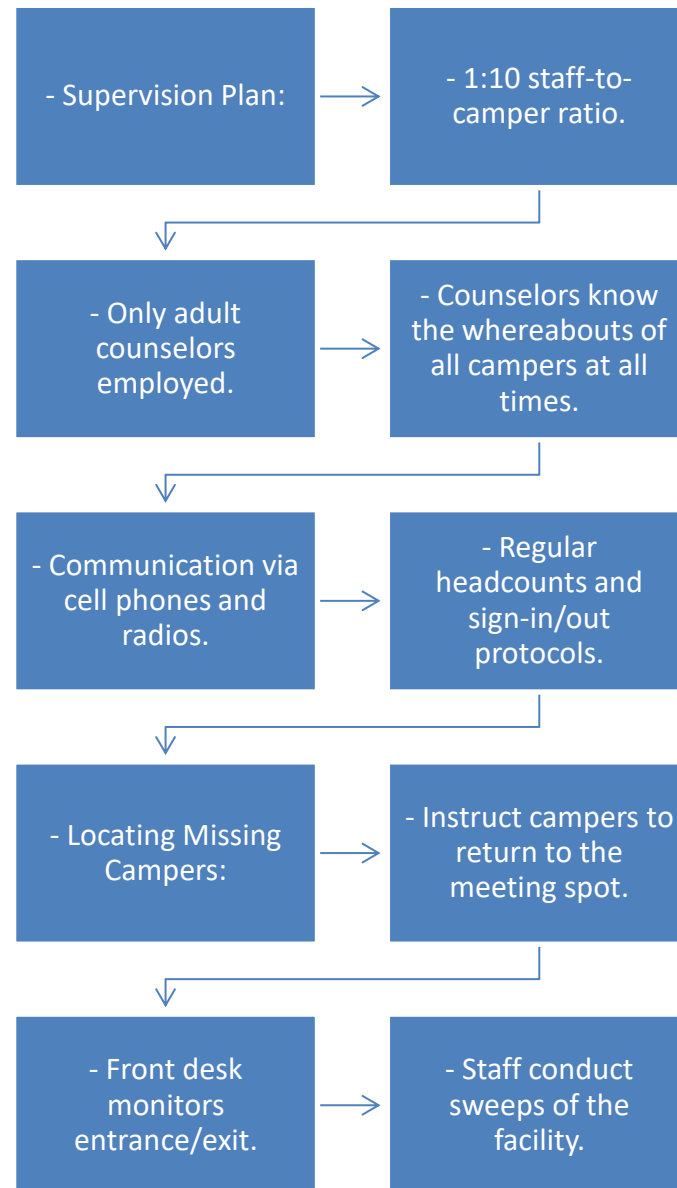

Fire Emergency Plans

- Fire Evacuation Procedure:

- Staff/campers trained in fire procedures.

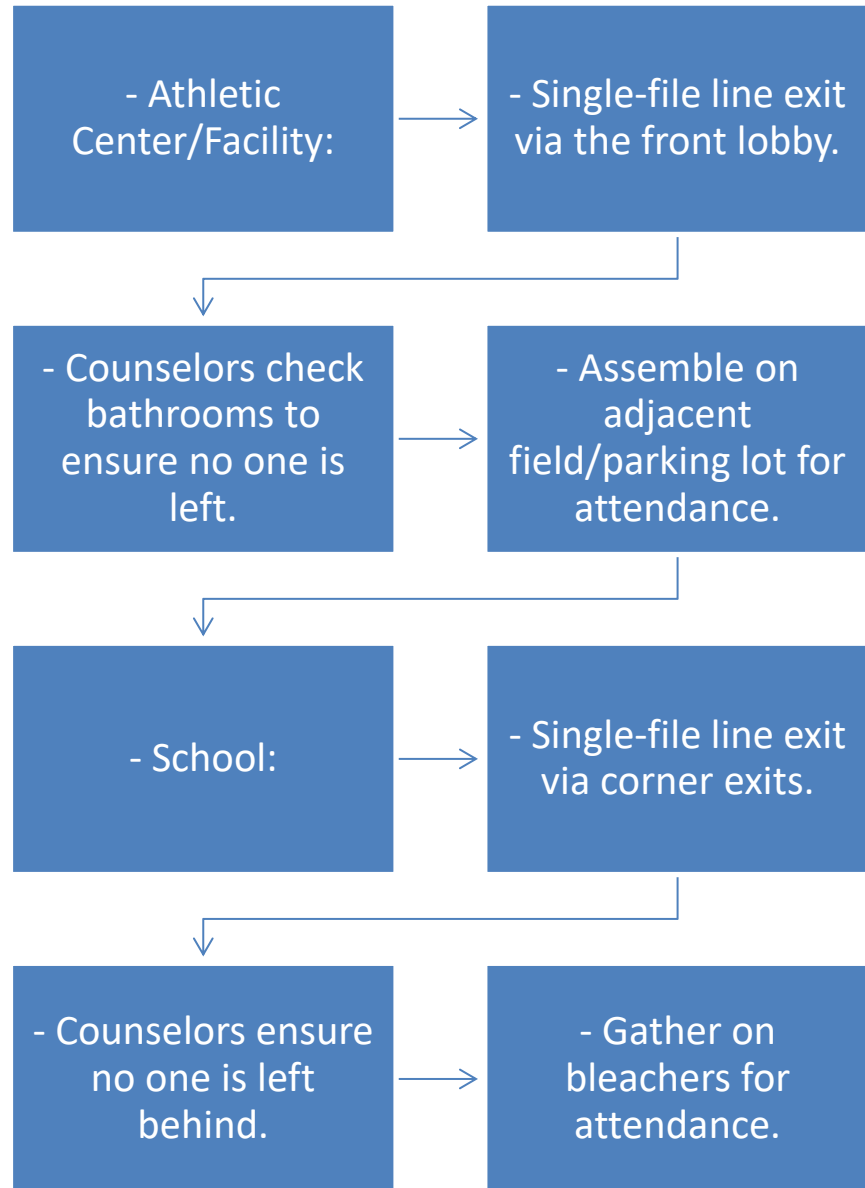
- Identified gathering spots for all exits.

- Director carries a camper roster for verification.

- Fire drills conducted within the first two days of camp.

- Evacuation diagrams posted in the facility.

General Evacuation Plans



Parent Pick-Up Procedures

- Group Pick-Up
(Outside):

- Use adjacent
parking lot for
evacuations.

- Provide shaded
areas during
excessive heat.

- Group Pick-Up
(Inside):

- Early dismissals in
camp meeting
areas or concrete
locker rooms.

- Alternate
locations used if
the first floor is
unsafe.

- Individual Pick-
Up:

- Campers rest in
designated health
areas with staff
supervision.

Code Red
Ozone Alerts
- Severe
Heat

Key Actions:

- Move activities indoors and limit vigorous activity.

- Encourage frequent hydration.

- Monitor campers for heat illnesses (Cramps, Exhaustion, Stroke).

Signs to Watch:

- Cramps, lightheadedness, nausea, confusion, or unconsciousness.

Natural Disaster Procedures

Hurricanes/Severe Thunderstorms:

- Monitor weather reports.
 - Cancel activities if a hurricane is forecasted.
 - During storms, move campers to concrete locker rooms.
 - Wait 30 minutes after lightning detection.

Tornado:

- Move campers to concrete locker rooms.
 - Post-tornado: Check injuries, provide first aid, and notify emergency services.

Floods:

- Relocate campers to the second floor if flooding occurs.
 - Ensure early guardian pick-up as needed.

Contacting Emergency Services

911 Protocol:

- A counselor calls 911 and describes the situation.

- Another counselor stays with the emergency.

- Greet emergency responders and guide them to the scene.

- Parent/Guardian Notification:

- Director retrieves contact info and calls parents.

- Explain the situation and steps taken.

- Designate a waiting area for guardians.
