

Project Inc.:

1. Camp Team Banner
 - Each Team/Group should be given a Huge Roll of Paper. The Counselor and Team should strategize about what a theme for the banner should be. The Counselor should assist in “sketching” the outline of the banner at large, then assign sections of the banner to each member of the team to complete with their own personal touch.
2. Make Your Own Jersey
 - Each camper should be given notice to bring in a plain white t-shirt. The t-shirt will be their canvass for decorating it as a sports jersey. Counselors should assist with outlining anything that the camper wants added – player name, number, team name. Make sure supplies for decorating jersey are available for activity.
3. Personal Flag
 - Help campers celebrate their special gifts and talents with personal flags. Give each camper a canvas, either large size paper or cloth and various art supplies. Ask them to create a flag that represents who they are. Tell them to include family background, interests, talents and things that are special to them. Give each child the opportunity to discuss their flag with the group. Hang the flags around the room to celebrate the unique composition of the class.
4. Make a Coin
 - Provide each camper an oversized piece of cardboard, plastic, etc. (something that can be flipped) that is a perfect circle and can be decorated by drawing or painting. Campers may design a personalized coin making sure that there is a “heads” and “tails” side.
5. Tie Dye – Pillowcase
 - Each camper should be given notice to bring in a plain pillowcase. Tie It - Grab a small section of the pillowcase, both front and back layers, and twist it as tightly as possible. Fold over the tip of the twist and fasten it snugly with a rubber band. Make different-size twists all over your pillowcase, or keep them consistent and in a pattern. Dye It - Fill the bottles with the individually prepared dye baths and squeeze drops onto your pillowcase.
6. Camp Newspaper
 - Create a name for the newspaper. Create an outline/layout for the newspaper. Each Team/Group will be responsible for a section of the “weekly newspaper”. Sections can include News, Sports, Weather, Editorial, Art, Food, etc. Topics must be approved. Campers should work on writing articles or interviewing subjects. Make sure Counselors edit the campers work. Pictures and Drawings should be incorporated throughout the layout. Make sure copies can be printed and handed out to each camper.

7. Marble Run Track

- A rolling ball sculpture, sometimes referred to as a marble run, is a form of kinetic art – an art form that can contain moving pieces – that specifically involves one or more rolling balls. Typically made of cardboard, wood, or plastic and feature small, interlocking pieces that can generate a large number of track configurations. More complicated add-ons can include jumps, loops, trampolines, ramps, etc. Using the rims of paper plates, tissue rolls, and plastic tubes are the easiest and most common materials to create the track

8. Make a Map

- Decide what the map should be of. Indoor or outdoor space? Community or building? Treasure Map? Either way, you will want to show various points of interest and to also concentrate on “scale”. The map must be drawn to scale and must have directions indicated. The scale which you choose will determine how many miles each inch on the map represents. Or you can have an inch represent a certain number of blocks of the town. In one corner of the map, draw a square. In this square, print what the map represents, the name of the maker and the date made, compass directions, distance or scale, key or legend, symbols that are used to represent various objects, such as the symbol for a church, a school, a fire house, a road, hill or mountain, river, etc. To indicate the compass direction, in one corner of the map draw an arrow with the tip pointing north, and the letter N printed above the tip. Make the map with north at the upper end of the paper, as is usual for all maps. The signs or symbols used in the map are interpreted by the key or legend, as mentioned above. The map should include structures as well as natural items. Construction points to be noted include buildings, roads, fences, railroads, and bridges. Natural items include streams, woods, lakes, fields, and swamps.

9. Make a Musical Instrument

- Balloon Drum

10. Decorate Flower Pot / Make Flower Arrangement (real or craft flowers)
